Brigid's Path Celebrates Milestone

100 Babies, Families Helped since Organization Opened Its Doors

KETTERING, OH (September 4, 2020) – [Brigid's Path](#), the first newborn recovery center in Ohio, today announced it has helped 100 babies and families impacted by addiction.

Since welcoming its first infant in December 2017, the team at Brigid's Path has focused on caring for infants born exposed to addictive substances like prescription medication, opioids or other drugs, while also working with community partners to provide low-cost, holistic services to our families.

"Brigid's Path began as a dream," said Jill Kingston, executive director. "I believed there [had to be a better way](#) of caring for babies like the two babies who we were fostering at the time – and we're living proof there is a better way. We just had to create it!"

Kingston credits a dedicated team of more than 50 trained medical professionals and more than 120 volunteers with the young organization's success.

"We believe all people are worthy of respect without condition," Kingston continued. "And we practice that each and every day. Our staff has supported our mothers and parents through some really hard times, but we've rejoiced alongside them in sweet times, too. We continue to receive updates on many of our graduates, and it is a joy to see many of our families doing well for the long haul."

A few of the quantifiable [measures of success](#) for Brigid's Path:

- In 2019, more than 120 volunteers shared more than 13,000 hours of their time with Brigid's Path.
- Brigid's Path has [never](#) had to give a rescue dose of medication and never delayed a weaning.
- Without Brigid's Path, 24 babies would have been placed immediately into foster care from hospital care in 2019. Instead, receiving care at Brigid's Path gave families more time and space to determine their next right steps.
