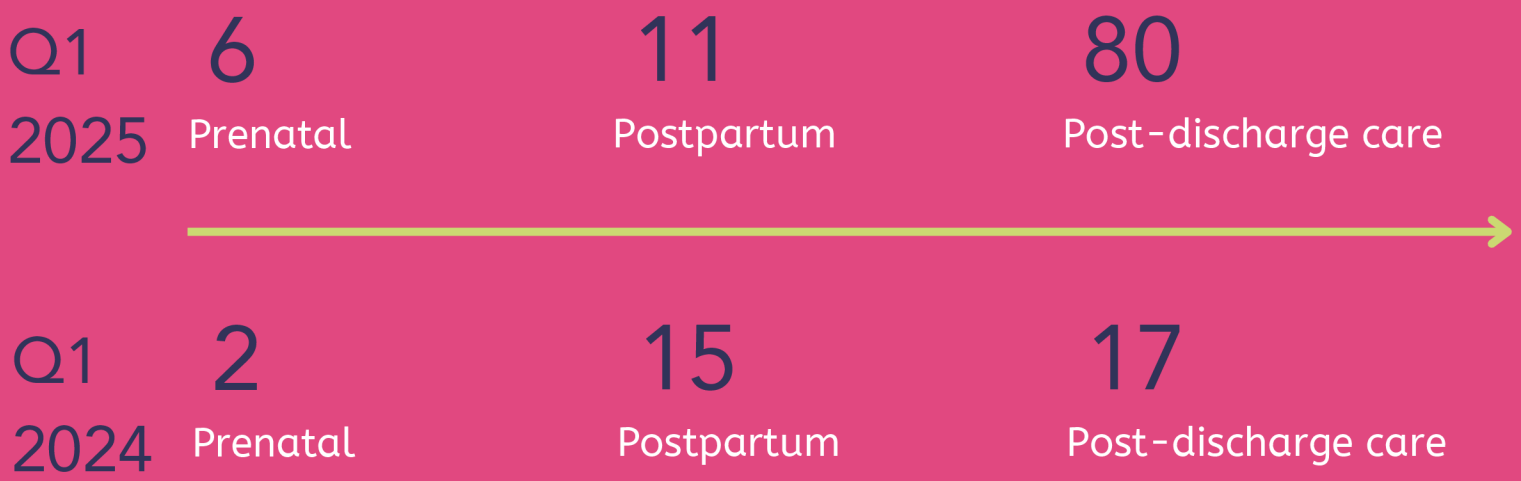

Transformation Scores

Every family in care of Brigid’s Path completes a series of surveys to help us better understand their experience, what we can improve, and their perspective on the transformation happening in their life.

In Q1 2025, our family transformation score was 100% - very positive and indicative of the transformation families perceive happening!

In late Q1 2025, one of our family advocates received an exciting update from an aftercare mom. She shared that she had recently gotten her own car and successfully opened her own bank account. In addition to these accomplishments, she has been working full-time and is doing an exceptional job caring for her baby.

Since her baby’s discharge at the beginning of Q1 2025, she has made remarkable progress, demonstrating significant strides toward independence and stability.
