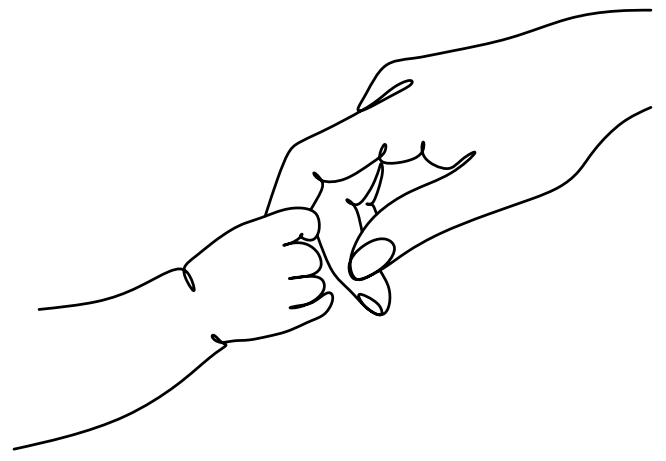

Milestone Moments of Q3 2025

We received a call from a grandmother urgently seeking resources for her daughter and unborn grandson. At the time, her daughter was incarcerated due to a probation violation and was not expected to be released until November, while the baby was due in September. Without intervention, the newborn would have entered foster care—a process that often results in prolonged separation, even when a parent’s absence is temporary. Brigid’s Path was able to step in and provide safe, nurturing care for the baby during the two months before his mother’s release. When she was released from prison, she came directly to Brigid’s Path to reunite with her baby and began the next phase of her recovery. She later transitioned successfully into a sober living program, maintaining custody and continuing to build stability for herself and her child. This intervention prevented an unnecessary foster care placement and ensured that mother and baby remained connected during a critical bonding period.

Stories of Transformation

In September, we received a referral for a mother and newborn who were facing the imminent possibility of custody removal. Child welfare involvement had escalated to the point where the agency was preparing to file for custody. Through our advocacy work and collaboration with community partners, Brigid's Path was able to support an alternative plan that allowed the baby to be admitted to our program while remaining in the mother's legal custody. During her time at Brigid's Path, the mother maintained her sobriety, secured employment, and actively engaged in parenting and recovery supports. With stable housing and a strong support system in place, she successfully transitioned home with her baby. Today, she is living independently, continues to do well in her recovery, and is raising her child in a safe and nurturing environment.
